Mission


Integrated development in the underserved regions through people's participation, building capacities and skills for optimal use of abundant resources.

Thematic Domain

1. *Livelihood Promotion*

Agri. Allied Intervention

α) Livestock Promotion

A total of 1200 families are directly involved in livestock activity such as Piggery, Goattery, Poultry and Duckery. Successful model developed on low cost shed improving health and hygiene of livestock's as well as the households as well as improved way of rearing practices. A total of 800 households additionally earning 50,000/- to 70,000/- through sale of livestock's every year.



B. Horticulture Intervention

The Horticulture intervention is an intensive agriculture activity promoted by Diya Foundation. The crops cultivated under this domain are Arecanut, Banana, Lemon, Pineapple. The horticulture plantation is intercropped with spices, sericulture and is mainly practised in the homestead land. A total 2000 households successfully adopted this practice. And a total 300 farmers turned into progressive farmer cultivating commercially such as Banana, Arecanut, Lemon and 50 of them intercropped their horticulture plantation with spices such as Ginger, Turmeric, Black Pepper etc.

Through this practice farmers earn Rs. 30,000/- to 50,000/- additionally bringing significant change into their lives such as living conditions, investing in children's education, household infrastructure.



C. Spice Promotion

Diya has been engaged in Spice promotion among the households affected by wild elephants and animals. Spice crops such as Black pepper, Ginger, Turmeric, it has adopted by 2000 households. Spice cultivation is integrated with homestead crop area and Black Pepper is integrated with Arecanut. It has been one of the main source of income earning of the household.



D. Sericulture

Sericulture rearing is one of the good practice followed by the Rabha tribal community in Rani, Chayani and Chhaygaon Dev. Block of Kamrup Rural, Assam. A total of 500 households are rearing sericulture throughout the year and are making an income of Rs. 3500/- to 4000/- additionally every month. Under sericulture they rear Eri silk and Muga silk.



B. Decentralized Renewal Energy

Renewable energy plays an important role into the lives of small entrepreneurs situated in the remote part of Assam and Meghalaya. This intervention has reach out in the Assam in the district Kamrup Rural, Goalpara and Darrang. In Meghalaya this program could reach out entrepreneurs of Ri-Bhoi District especially in the boarder areas of Assam – Meghalaya (Ri-Bhoi and Kamrup)

Energy in this part is not constant and therefore due to lack of constant energy flow small entrepreneurs income remain inconsistence and therefore Solar Energy play vital role in income generating as well as efficiency of work and timely delivery of orders. Through this program Diya Foundation could support 100 small entrepreneurs into the field of Tailoring, Eri Spinning, Irrigation, Elephant rapeller, Refrigerator, Egg Incubator, Lok seva Kendra, Rice holler units, Spice grinding units etc. This intervention also could break the barriers and conceptual clarity among the community that “Solar could solve energy problems and gaps”.



C. Health & Hygiene

1. Maternal Health

Health plays an important role in a person's life especially the women and child. Diya is actively promoting Respectful Maternity Care through awareness and advocacy among the stakeholders and Child bearing mothers. Diya conducts awareness and sensitization program to ASHA workers that they actively guide the child bearing mothers and bridge with VHSND's and health facilities for health and safe birth.

In this connection Diya also gather data with respect to maternal deaths, maternity care in health facilities, functions of VHSND's etc and analyse and present to stakeholders for better strategy development for better function.

Diya is also proud member of **The White Ribbon Alliance India** and holds the secretariat for Assam chapter call The White Ribbon Alliance Assam for actively building alliance of individuals, institutions and civil society organization for promotion Respectful Maternity Care for Safe Mother in Assam.



2. Mental Health

Mental Health or Mental Disorder's are seen very common this days in every place. As per the UN Report on Mental Health, almost one million people die due to suicide every year, and it is the third leading cause of death among young people. Depression is the leading cause of years lost due to disability worldwide. Depression is ranked third in the global burden of disease, and is projected to rank first in 2030.

Since last one year Diya Foundation in collaboration with The Ant, a NGO based in Bongaigaon, Chirang is actively providing Mental Health care facilities in a small way in Kamrup Rural District of Assam. Till date more than 280 patient have registered for the camp and almost 55 to 60 percent patient attend monthly camp every month regularly. The treatment facilities that are being served in the monthly camp are such as Schizophrenia, schizotypal, Delusional, Somatoform disorders, Epilepsy etc.

The success result is seen very good almost 85 to 90 percent patient attaining monthly camps and regularly medicating are under control. Patients largely from Assam and Meghalaya are benefitting through this program.



D. Education and Literacy

Education is the primary need in one's life to grow socially, mentally, emotionally and financially. People residing in backward regions lack in education and hence lies behind in this challenging world. Parents cannot incur education expenses which keep increasing yearly leading to many dropouts, thus declining the literacy rate in the society. Taking all stuff into account, DiYA Foundation initiated the KKHSOU program under the Govt. of Assam to fairly educate the interested people of the area achieving 95 percent positive response in all streams. In this study centre a candidates who desire to enrol should attain at least 19 years of age. Any candidate above 19 years of age can get enrolled irrespective of his/her qualification is up to primary level but can enrolled in Bachelors' Preparatory Program (BPP).

Diya also initiated Education and Child Rights program under Ri-Bhoi in Meghalaya and Kamrup District of Assam covering 24 primary schools and giving the education on their rights as children and Right to Education. Also conducting remedial class for the weak students regularly. It is also a bridging courses who are detached with books during the lock down especially children in the border areas and forest villages and Tea garden areas. All total 550 students are regularly getting this sessions and they are now able to read and write properly.



E. Institution Building


Diya Foundation focuses on initializing community for their sustainable development, Diya Foundation's approach in development intervention are keeping women in the forefront and working for them for empowerment. likewise Diya Foundation successfully promoted 85 nos. women Self Help Group, promoted them into Village Organization and linked them Assam State Rural Livelihood Mission (ASRLM). This intervention is happening under Ri-Bhoi of Meghalaya and Kamrup Rural District of Assam.

Along with this Diya also successfully two women farmers producer company namely 1. Rangsang Agro. Producer Company Limited and 2. Mapakkai Agro Producer Company Limited comprising 600 and 500 members respectively. Under Rangsang there are 300 shareholders and in Mapakkai Agro Producer Company Limited is consist of 220 shareholders. Rangsang's primary activity is Spice such as Black Pepper, Turmeric and Ginger and Horticulture and Mapakkai's primary activities are Sericulture, Livestock.

In the coming year Diya focuses to form 2 more farmer producer companies in the Ri-Bhoi District of Meghalaya and Kamrup Rural District of Assam.




